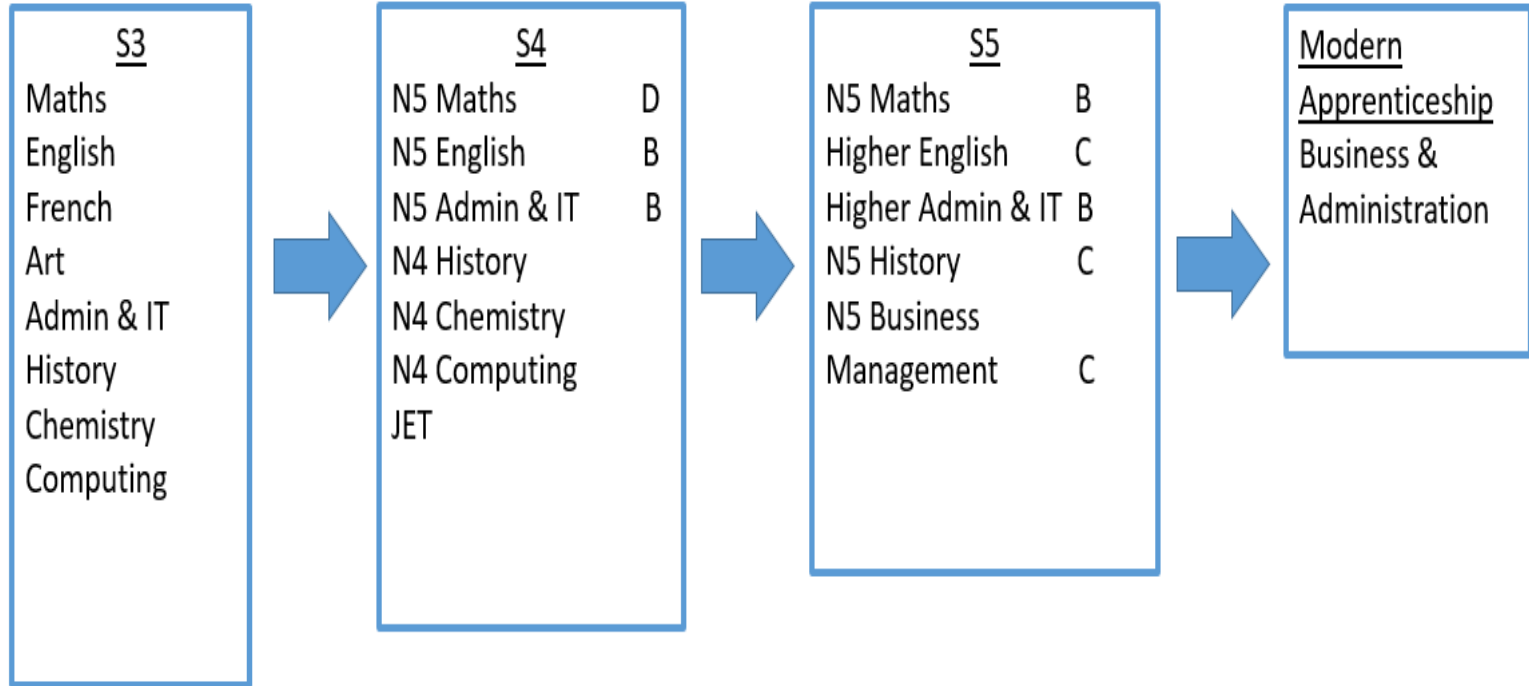


DURING

- Students would enter new subject at most appropriate level

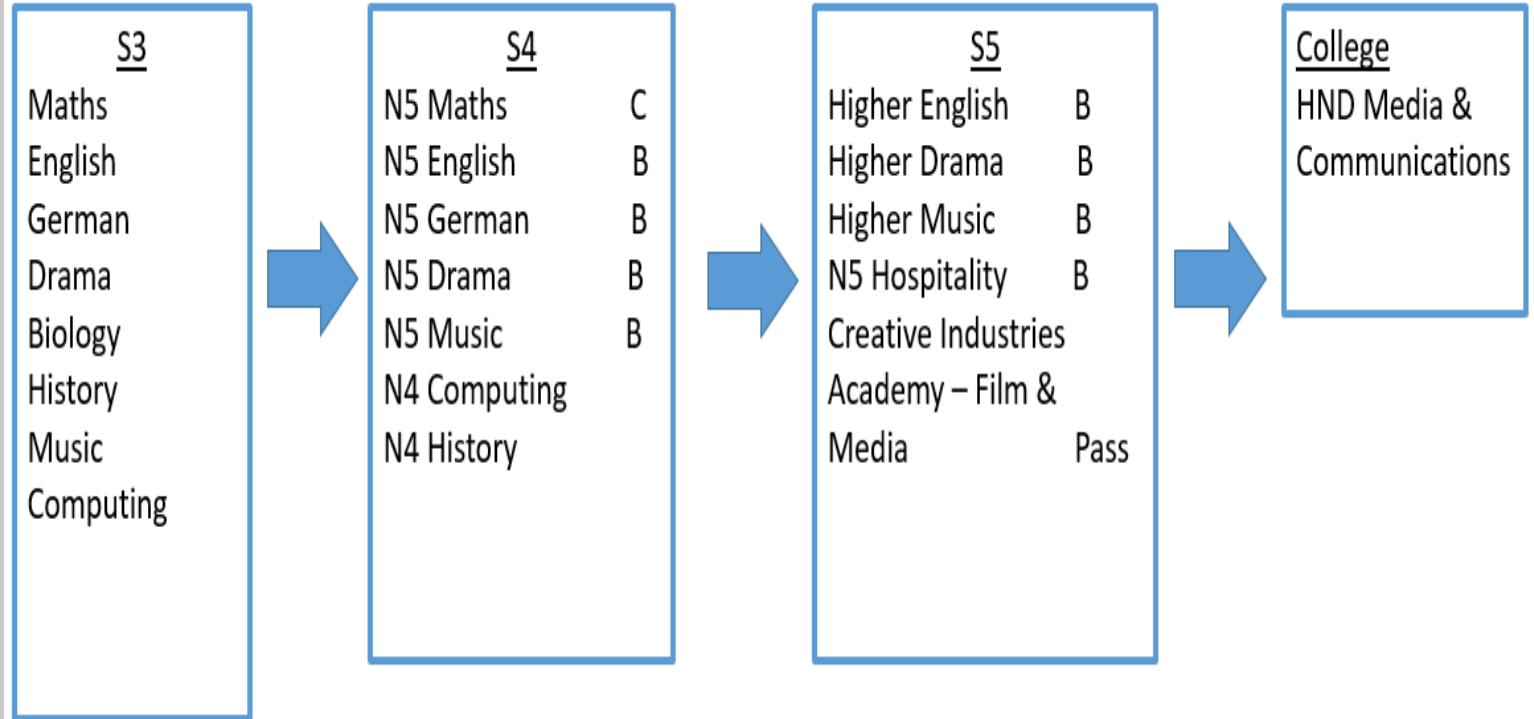


LEARNER JOURNEY 1



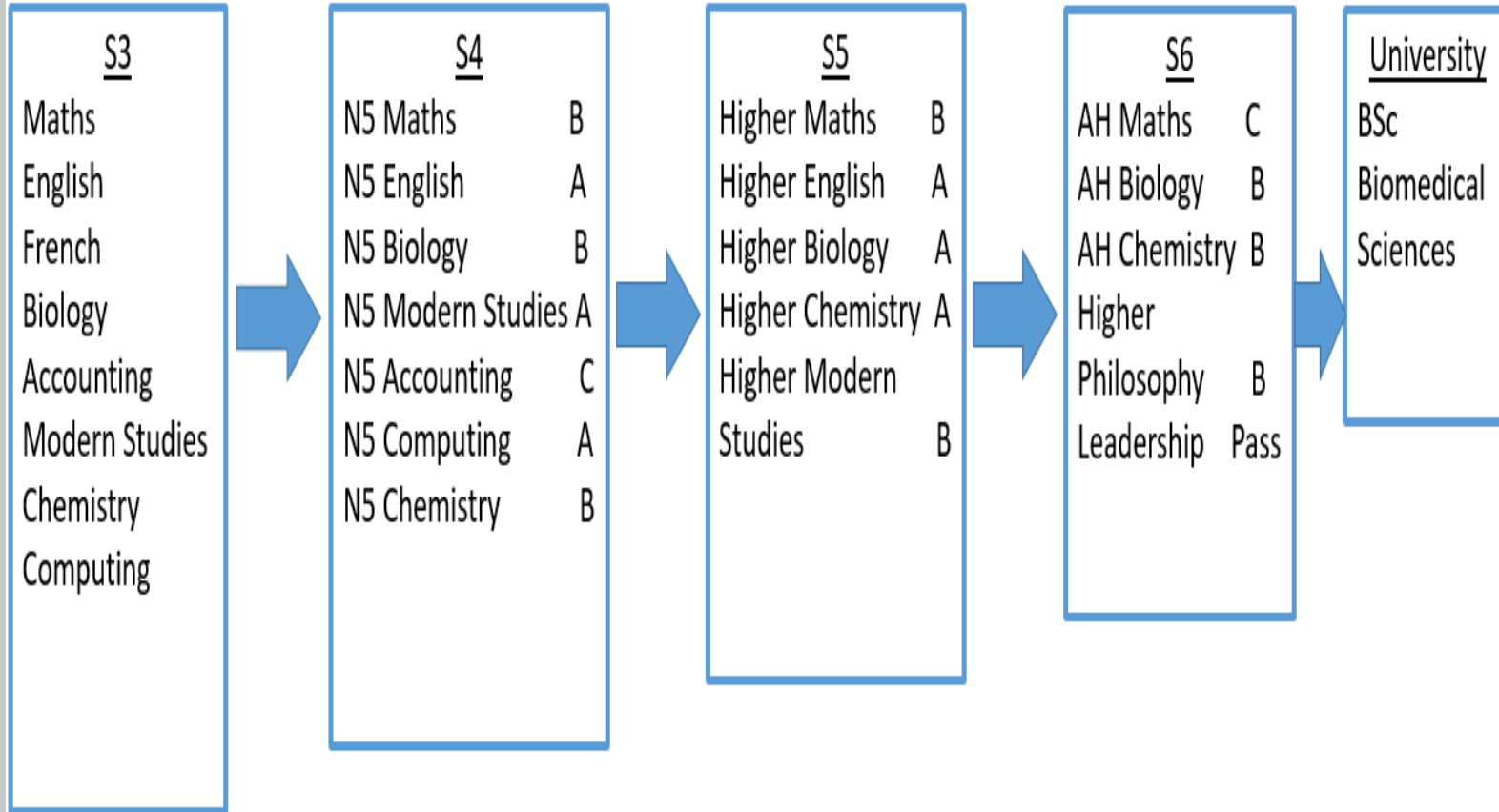

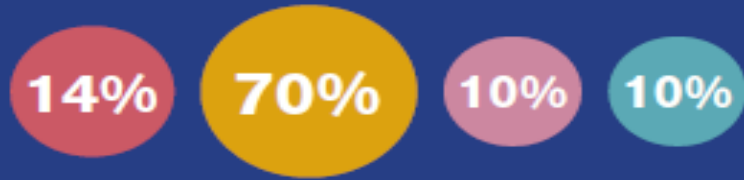
