

SDS service offer in Senior Phase

- Routes & Pathways lesson delivered to all S4 PSE classes
- Current S3 pupils have also had PSE input looking at progression opportunities
- S5 and S6 PSE input where required
- Support with coursing exploring career pathways from school subjects and checking entry requirements for further study or employment/apprenticeships
- One-to-one appointments available to all developing Career Management Skills to work towards achieving positive post-school destinations
- Working alongside Developing Young Workforce employer engagement
- Assisting with applications to Further & Higher Education programmes
- Promoting My World of Work and apprenticeship pathways (apprenticeships.scot)
- Continuing careers support into post-school if required

Careers support with coursing

- Pupils can ask their Guidance Teacher to refer them for careers support and subject choice discussion
- In appointments we may:
- Look at job profiles on My World of Work
- Use the option choice tool on My World of Work
- Review entry requirements for university, college and apprenticeships...
- ...to check for specific subjects and qualifications required
- Use Career Management Skills to ensure the pupil is confident in their choice of pathway

Some of them you'll have already – just by being you!






Where did last years school leavers go?

Qualifications

An honours degree (SCQF Level 10) recognised by Architects Registration Board (ARB) or Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA).


Minimum entry to an Architecture degree (SCQF Level 9/10) is Highers at ABBB (some courses ask for AABB) or an HND.

Entry to postgraduate qualifications (SCQF Level 11) usually require a first or second class degree in architecture and an academic portfolio, though degrees relating to the built environment may be considered.

Useful subjects

- English (required by most courses)
- Maths (required by most courses)
- Physics (required by most courses)
- Art and design
- Design and manufacture
- Graphic communication




Developing the Young Workforce (DYW) is the Scottish Government's Youth Employment strategy to better prepare young people for the world of work.
