





Average Total Tariff Points







ALTERNATIVE ASSESSMENT ARRANGEMENTS



Assessment arrangements allow candidates who are disabled, and/or have been identified as having additional support needs, access to appropriate arrangements to complete assessment without compromising integrity.

This is subject and assessment specific where evidence of impact is collected and demonstrated.











AAA EXAMPLES...



A learner experiencing mental health difficulties, who is very lethargic first thing in the morning due to medication, may need the start time of all assessments adjusted

A neurodivergent learner with dyslexia who experiences difficulties with processing written text, may need a text <u>reader</u> and may also need <u>extra time</u> to complete an assessment in English.

A History candidate with who has persistent difficulties with concentrating such as ADHD (attention deficit hyperactivity disorder), may need to undertake an exam in a room with only a small number of learners.











SQA ESTIMATES

• In March, SQA require estimated grades from teachers, (found in the working grade of the March Tracking Report).

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Estimates are used by SQA for ECCS and Appeals.









A marking review (clerical check) checks that:

- All parts of your SQA-assessments have been marked
- •The marking is in line with national standards
- The marks given for each answer have been totalled correctly
- •The correct result has been entered on the SQA system
- •Not available to A's or band upgrades or exceptional circumstances.
- •Results could stay the same, go up or go down.
- Senior Marker does this process.



SQA EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES

EECCS Supports learners who have been:

- unable to attend the exam
- •or whose performance in an exam has been affected by a personal circumstance, or an unplanned incident on the day
- •they must have completed all non-exam elements of the course to be eligible
- An estimate must have been submitted by their teacher

Teachers provide assessment evidence to substantiate the estimate. This will allow <u>SQA to award</u> as they see appropriate.


