

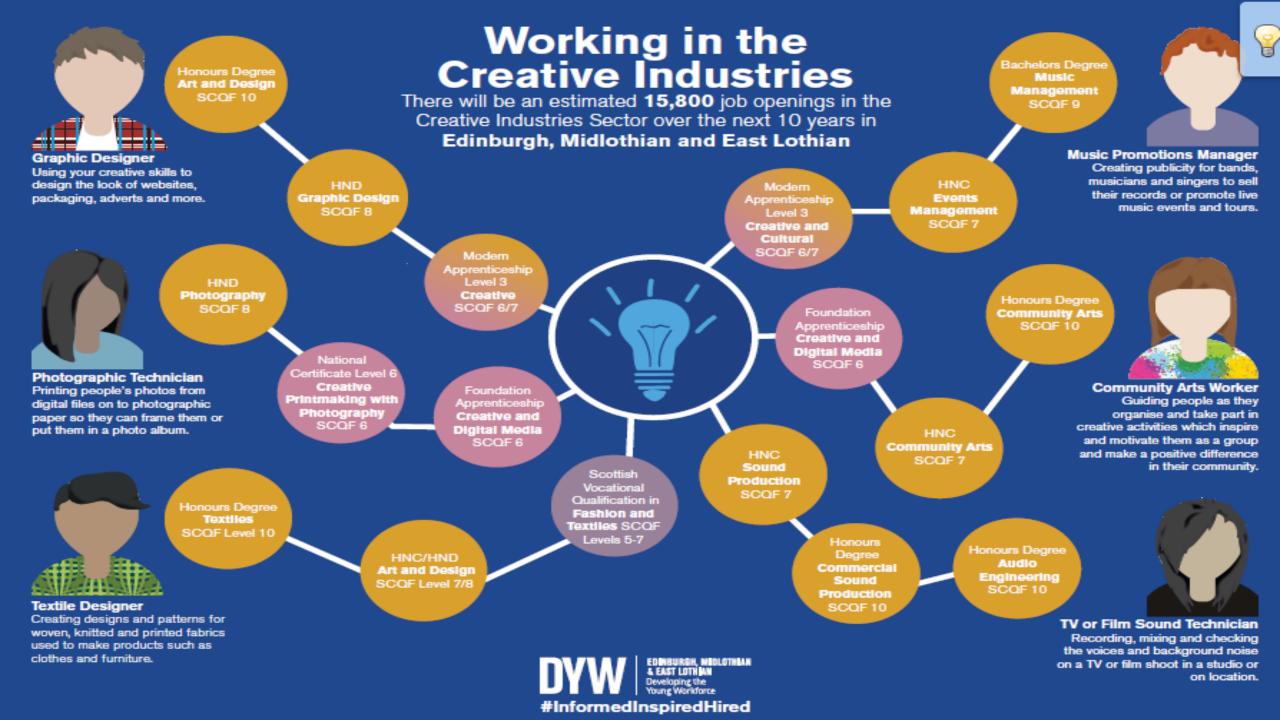

S2 Pathway Planning (for current S1 pupils)

Our S2 curriculum ensures young people study all curricular areas and cover the full range of Experiences and Outcomes within Scotland's Curriculum. In the majority of curricular areas pupils will continue to work in their current classes as they develop their skills and knowledge. However, there will be the opportunity to make five decisions from the curricular areas of world languages, expressive arts and technologies to personalise their S2 curriculum.

This approach is designed to allow each pupil to explore areas of interest, build on their individual strengths and develop more depth in their learning. This will encourage pupils to take more ownership of their learning as they progress from S2 into S3 and beyond.

S2 3 periods French

Content

in French, pupils will continue to build and consolidate skills in the areas of talking, reading, writing and listening. They will apply their learning to a deeper level of study in different cultural contexts, including learning more about food, countries where the language is spoken and young people who live there. They will engage in role play, research and enjoy film, fun books, and songs in the language they chose to study.

Progression

Assessments will be well prepared and supported, allowing pupils to plan for progress on the areas of talking, reading, writing and listening. They will identify their strengths and areas in which they would like to develop. Pupils can continue with this language into \$3 and \$4 where they will progress into level 4/5 content.

Music Performance

The S2 Music Performance course will give our young people the chance to study Music more intensively than in S1, focusing on four units of work; in these, they will perform as a group, listen to music and learn to analyse it, and create their own music, all in the contexts of World Music, Scottish Music, Music in the Media, and Popular Music. As well as all of this, they will choose two instruments, or one instrument and voice, and learn individual pieces on these, developing their musicianship, performing skills, and building confidence, self-esteem, and high levels of communication skills and emotional intelligence. Being skilled on an instrument, or being a great singer, or both, is truly a chance at a lifetime of happiness, enjoyment, and a fantastic opportunity to open all kinds of doors, in all kinds of fields: don't pass it up.

Progression

Pupils may choose to further their studies in 53 where they could attain a National 3/4 Music qualification. Further progression to National 5, Higher and Advanced Higher Music is possible from \$4 - 6. An alternative to this would be NPA Level 6 in Music Performance.
