
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

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
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Pathway Planning

S2 Pathway Planning (for current S1 pupils)

Our S2 curriculum ensures young people study all curricular areas and cover the full range of Experiences and Outcomes within Scotland's Curriculum. In the majority of curricular areas pupils will continue to work in their current classes as they develop their skills and knowledge. However, there will be the opportunity to make five decisions from the curricular areas of world languages, expressive arts and technologies to personalise their S2 curriculum.

This approach is designed to allow each pupil to explore areas of interest, build on their individual strengths and develop more depth in their learning. This will encourage pupils to take more ownership of their learning as they progress from S2 into S3 and beyond.

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
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


Food & Consumer Technology 2 periods

Why choose Food and Consumer Technology
This course is an excellent choice for students wishing to build their skills and knowledge in practical cookery, health, nutrition and food product development. Students will engage in a practical activity once a week to consolidate learning and develop vital skills for life. This course also provides learner readiness to access the wide range of exciting courses offered in FCT in senior phase.

Course content
Learners will develop a range of cookery skills, techniques and processes through weekly practical activities where challenge will arise. Learner knowledge will be strengthened on understanding and using ingredients effectively, to fulfil design and make projects throughout the year, embedding personalisation and choice. Organisational skills including accurate weighing and measuring, time management and general organisation in the kitchen will be learnt. Food science will feature in teaching practice allowing learners the opportunity to put their gown on! Learners will deepen their understanding of nutrition, Scottish Dietary Goals and dietary diseases.

Progression
Learners may choose to further their studies into S3 where they could attain a National 3/4 Practical Cookery and National 3/4 Health and Food Technology Qualification. With further progression into S4/5 when studying National 5/ Higher Health and Food Technology, and/or National 5 Practical Cookery.
